I only realized this after volunteering with Chai Lifeline's *i-Shine* program. *i-Shine* is a youth program that aims to support children who are struggling with the loss of a parent.

I have worked specifically with two young girls who are now in the third grade, but I started with them when they were in Kindergarten. They were not friends when I began working with them, but throughout the years, they have formed a strong bond and have become inseparable.

It has been heartwarming to witness their growth and development as individuals and as friends, and to know that I played a small role in fostering their relationship.

You can rebuild a burnt down house, but it will never be quite the same. With *i-Shine*, I strive every day to ensure that these children do not know the difference. My experience with *i-Shine* has been incredibly rewarding and has enriched my life in countless ways.
